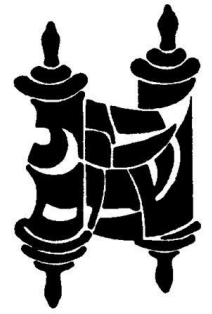


TBS-EV SCHOLAR IN RESIDENCE WEEKEND:

MICHAEL UNGAR BIOGRAPHY

Michael Ungar's parents were Holocaust survivors who married after World War II. As the Communist Iron Curtain was descending over Eastern Europe, his parents were captured attempting to escape to Israel and were jailed as Zionist conspirators. While serving their jail sentence, Michael was born in the prison medical facility in 1949.

During the Hungarian Revolution of 1956, Michael's family escaped from Hungary to the West. After a period of time in an Austrian refugee camp, his family were granted authorization by the American government to immigrate to the United States.

Michael and his family settled in the Los Angeles area and he has ever since resided in Southern California.

Michael graduated from California State University at Northridge with a B.A. degree in Political Science and received a Juris Doctorate degree from Southwestern University School of Law. He has a credential as a California Community College Instructor and is admitted to practice before the Superior Courts of California, the U.S. District Courts and Court of Appeals, and the United States Supreme Court.

Upon his graduation from law school in 1974, Michael served as a legislative intern and constituent advocate for a California State Senator. He thereafter went on to hold employment positions as counsel for several corporations. Since 1980, he has maintained his own law practice and has specialized in the fields of civil litigation, contract law, construction law, personal injury law, criminal law, landlord tenant law, and family law. Occasionally, Mr. Ungar has served as a Judge Pro Tem in the Superior Court of the County of Los Angeles.

Michael Ungar has received citations for his public service from the California State Senate, the California State Assembly, the Shriners, Optimists, Rotarians, Lions, Pioneer Women, Torrance Little League, Palos Verdes Library Board, County of Los Angeles, and the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. For four years, Mr. Ungar served as an elected member of the Palos Verdes Library Board.

Michael has also been an active member of his Jewish community. He served two terms as President of his congregation and as a Board member for several years. He has taught numerous classes and multi-week courses at Reform, Conservative, and Orthodox institutions on a variety of Jewish subjects such as: The History of Jews in the United States, The History of Jews in the American Military, Moses in America, Jews in Sports, The History of Zionism and the Modern State of Israel, The Golden Age of Jews in Spain, The Great Spanish Rabbis, The Great Babylonian Rabbis, Portraits of the Great Rabbis and Jewish Thinkers Throughout History, The Talmud and Its Relevance Today. Currently, Michael is writing an Encyclopedia on the Talmud.

Mr. Ungar's other interests include politics, sports, music and the arts, stamp and coin collecting and maintaining his personal Jewish library of several thousand books.

Michael is married to Paula Ungar, a psychotherapist. They have two children and four grandchildren.
